

Global Land Summit: 60 Nations, Including Japan, Confirm Attendance for ICARRD+20 in Cartagena

CARTAGENA, COLOMBIA — The world is turning its eyes toward the Colombian Caribbean as momentum builds for the **Second International Conference on Agrarian Reform and Rural Development (ICARRD+20)**. With just weeks to go, organizers have confirmed that delegates from **60 countries**—including a high-level representation from **Japan**—have already committed to joining this historic global dialogue from **February 24 to 28, 2026**.

Twenty years after the landmark summit in Brazil, ICARRD+20 arrives at a critical juncture for the planet. Hosted by the Government of Colombia in partnership with the Government of Brazil and the FAO, the conference will gather over **1,500 participants** to redefine the future of land, peace, and food sovereignty.

A Global Coalition for Change

The diversity of the delegations—spanning five continents—underscores the urgency of the agenda. From the technological and institutional insights of **Japan** to the ancestral wisdom of Indigenous Peoples and peasant communities, ICARRD+20 is a melting pot of solutions for the world's most pressing challenges.

"There will be no peace without land, and no sustainability without social justice," states the conference mandate. "This is not just a meeting; it is a global movement to ensure that those who feed the world have the rights and dignity they deserve."

Why ICARRD+20 is the "Must-Watch" Event of 2026:

- **Massive Participation:** Over 100 countries are expected in total, with 60 already confirmed, including official government delegations and grassroots social leaders.
- **The "Colombia Model":** Host nation Colombia will showcase its "Agrarian Reform for Life," positioning land redistribution as the primary engine for ending conflict and protecting biodiversity.
- **Beyond the Soil:** The agenda tackles the "Thematic Tracks" that link land access to climate action, gender justice, and the transition away from illicit economies.

- **The Cartagena Backdrop:** The UNESCO World Heritage site serves as a symbolic bridge, connecting rural production with urban sustainability through innovative "circular economy" models.

The Stakes

Ratified by the FAO Council, ICARRD+20 is the only international forum of its kind with the legitimacy to update global commitments on land tenure. In a world facing rising hunger and climate instability, the decisions made in Cartagena will set the 2030 Agenda for rural transformation.
